Language Arts 8

Language arts is a multi-faceted course which covers numerous topics. In Language Arts 8, students will reinforce basic grammar principles such as parts of speech and apply this knowledge to their everyday communication with writing and speaking. In addition, students will study Greek and Latin roots and key words derived from these roots in order to increase their vocabulary knowledge and usage. Also, reading poetry and short stories in their literature book and novels will expose them to numerous authors and styles of writing from a Christian perspective. These pieces are meant to teach an understanding of people from different ages, cultures, and economic backgrounds as well as promote reading comprehension and an enjoyment of literature. Finally, writing will be incorporated through essay writing instruction, focusing on the narrative essay, and writing about literature through analysis and response.
